First part moderate breezes but inclining squally at 11 AM veered ship to the north all sail out sailing in light Middle part much the same at daylight tacked ship to the S. East latter part fine gentle breezes and pleasant weather S. Ends

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes and fine weather all sail out standing to the S. East Middle part much the same at daylight tacked ship to the S. East all sail out latter part employed coopers meat saw a school of porpoises

First part of these 24 hours gentle breezes all sail out steering West at 3 PM buffeted by the wind to the S. East Middle part much the same at daylight kept off ship at 10 AM saw a school of whales still in sight from 6 to 8 miles off the weather beam

Friday the 28<sup>th</sup>

First part moderate breezes at 1 PM hauled for whales trawling 6 miles to windward chased until sunset could not come up with them so came on board standing to the S. East at midnight tacked ship to the Northward at daylight tacked off to West at 8 AM saw Mary's Island bearing West latter part strong breezes all sail out running under the lee of the above Island at noon hauled aboard Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup>

First part gentle breezes and pleasant at 1 PM hauled for whales went on shore at 3 returned with fish and found this said Island is about 15 miles circumference has a large lagoon and when seen at a distance resembles land at 5 PM saw a sail suppose the Cambria to the north of us Middle part tacked ship to the North latter part light air heading S. East by South all sail out employed repairing a rather making a fore top sheet out of the Miz. top sail
