MAY. Tuesday the 13th

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the East all sail set Course better Steering Sails Set Saw a Ship Steering by to the East. Probably for California after Gold. Middle part Latter part do employed in Ship's duty Course S. by West

Wednesday the 16th
 Commenced with a brisk breeze from the S. East all sail set Course better by West. Middle part the same Latter part do Set down the fore top Gallant and Royal Mast and set up a Stunt top Gallant Mast

Thursday the 17th

Commenced with strong breeze from the South Saw fishbacks all sail set Course better Middle part strong breeze took in by West sail and hauled the main Course at 1 P.M. and shifted suddenly again to West to East Latter part light baffling wind from the East part Constant rain and thick fog

Friday the 18th
 Commenced with light baffling winds from the Eastward and thick foggy and rainy weather Middle part brisk breeze Latter part do and Constant rain Ship heading to West

Saturday the 19th

Commenced with strong breeze a thick rainy weather and a high swell blowing in doubled reefed fore and aft and hauled the main Course Middle part blowing on track in the fore top sail Latter part more moderate Made all sail and S. East and thick foggy

Sunday the 20th

Commenced with a thick foggy wind East Course better at 6 P.M. have the ship steaming a gale from the North Ship heading Ch. West Middle part the same Latter part do a thick foggy Saw a quantity of birds So Ends

MAY. Monday the 21st

First part of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the East heading to the Northward under a close reef. Main top sail and fore and main spinnaker Middle part moderating Made sail Latter part thick foggy gentle breeze from the East Course better employed in Ship's duty

Tuesday the 22nd

First part of these 24 hours moderate breeze from the East Course better all sail set sent down the main Royal yard and bent a new fore top Mast stay sail Middle part brisk breeze heading to the East Latter part light air from the East and thick foggy employed occasionally So Ends

Wednesday the 23rd

First part of these 24 hours light air and a thick foggy Steering sharp by heading to West Saw a frigate Middle part thick the same Latter part light breeze heading up to West all sail set took the foreward boom on deck found it split some repairs it cleaned the under room and shifted it again So Ends

Thursday the 24th

First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze and thick foggy weather all sail set heading up to West a high swell rolling from the East Middle part wind East Course better Latter part Set the fore top Mast Steering sail took breeze and foggy weather nothing in sight

Friday the 25th

First part of these 24 hours brisk breeze from South East all sail set Course better thick foggy weather Middle part the same at daylight wind from the South and foggy nothing in sight So Ends

Saturday the 26th

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the South and thick foggy weather all sail set Course better Saw a number of whale birds expect to see the whales Saw Middle part brisk breeze Latter part the same and thick foggy weather cannot see twice the length of the ship
