First part of the 24 hours a brisk breeze from the N. East. all Sail out Course S. West. employed cleaning Ship Middle part wind at North and thick foggy weather

West constant rain and fog cannot see far Middle part wind veering to the Westward at daylight Moderate breeze from the Westward latter part gentle breeze from the South and no fog weather in light employed setting up Shacks and other necessary duty

First part of the 24 hours gentle breeze from the Westward all Sail out Steering Sharp to the S. West employed setting up paper Shacks Middle part much the same

SEPTEMBER Saturday the 8th

First part Moderate breeze from the South all Sail out Steering to the Westward at 6 P. M. Steering changed to light Sails blowing in South part at Midnight a S. West gale from the S. East and a high Sea took in all Sail save a close reef Main top Sail

latter part the same heading S. West thick heavy party weather

Sunday the 9th

When 24 hours commences with a gale from the S. East and a hard Short Sea we under a close reef Main top Sail heading to the S. West Middle part moderating made Sail at daylight light air some the Ship was Ship to the Eastward

First part of the 24 hours light huffling winds from the South made all Sail were Ship heading West S. West
