SEPTEMBER. Monday 17<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours a brisk breeze from the South all Sail set Course S. East a remarkable smooth Sea and the Omega with every Stick that will draw Middle part light air from the South Course S. East

latter part light baffling winds and Calms employed keeping the Sabbath Sea Provisions and a fair look

Tuesday the 18<sup>th</sup>

First part light air and Calms all appearance of an Easterly wind Middle part a brisk breeze from the South all Sail set Sharp by to the Eastward

latter part a strong breeze from the West and somewhat squally all appearance a blue

Wednesday the 19<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a strong breeze from the West and squally Course S. East all Sail set Hoisting an 43.08 took in the Sails at sunset wind West and strong 171.10 breeze from S. East under whole top Sails Middle part the same latter part more moderate Made all Sail Steering S. E. by East Steering Sails low and aloft

Thursday 20<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward and a high swell all Sail set Course S. E. by East Middle part wind shifted to South Steering by to the East S. East latter part 41.50 wind S. West and plenty of it took in fore and 169.00 Miz top Sallant Sail S. East

Friday the 21<sup>st</sup>

Strong breeze from the West and a rough Sea Course S. E. by East under whole top Sails and Course 39.50 Middle part wind shifted to West Made all 167. Sail Steering S. East latter part wind the same and cloudy weather employed rigging out air with and fly Jibb hawser that is all in one Sheet S. East

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Saturday the 22<sup>nd</sup>

First part of these 24 hours a moderate breeze from the Eastward Steering Sails low and aloft Course S. East setting in light Middle part brisk breeze from the West latter part is and a clear air employed cleaning drying and bundling boxes S. East

Sunday the 23<sup>rd</sup>

First part of these 24 hours a strong breeze from the West all Sail set Course S. East employed bundling boxes and stowing it away have the run full and about 10,000 lbs between decks Middle part a brisk breeze from the West latter part light air and calms employed setting up pipe Shanks and cleaning Ship
