

Remarks on Board of "Bark Ontario" of N. Y.

Friday January 22nd 1864

Continued fresh Breeze from N.W. 3 P.M. Spoke Bark Stafford nothing since we saw her last and Ship Mt. Wallston Willy of New Bedford 14 Mo. but 8 bbls. Middle and Latter part fresh breeze heading various ways. Saw nothing remarkable. Employed in various jobs.

"Booka Bay" is

Saturday Jan^y 23rd

Fresh breeze & hazy weather the first part of this day. The remainder of this day much the same 3 vessels and the Land in sight. Watches employed in Ship duty. So Ends.

"Booka Bay" is

Sunday Jan^y 24th

Continued the same Middle and Latter part light baffling winds heading all round the Compass. Nothing in sight remarkable.

Monday Jan^y 25th

Same old story light baffling winds and rain squally. Saw 4 complete. Light baffling winds with rain in squally the rest of this day. heading various courses. Saw finback Porpoises and Blackfish.

Tuesday Jan^y 26th

Light breeze and Rain squally the first part of this day 2 vessels in sight. Middle and Latter part moderate breeze from N.E. heading various ways in hopes of seeing whales but could not see any. Ends squally & Rainy. Saw Blackfish the Land & 2 vessels.

Wednesday January 27th 1864

Commenced light breeze and Calms heading to the N.W. Watches employed in various jobs. Middle and Latter part Calm. Nothing in sight but Land.

"Booka Bay" is

Thursday Jan^y 28th

Continued calm. Middle and Latter parts light air and very warm heading various ways. Watches employed in repairing an old sail.

"Booka Bay" is

Wednesday Jan^y 29th

Throughout these 24 hours Light air from all points of the compass. finished the sail. Latter part employed setting up rigging &c &c.

"Booka Bay" is

Saturday Jan^y 30th

Continued light air heading along shore. Saw 4 Blackfish. Middle part the same. Latter part light breeze from N.W. heading by the compass to N.E. Saw 1 Blackfish. Watches employed as usual.

"Booka Bay" is

Sunday Jan^y 31st

First part moderate breeze from N.W. heading to N.E. Unbent Sprunkir to repair finished and bent again. Middle and Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. and squally with Rain. Saw 3 strange sails. but no whales. So Ends.

Monday February 1st 1864

Continued fresh breeze from the N.W. heading various ways. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze from N.W. heading by the wind on different tack. Saw 3 vessels. One Finback and the Land all along shore.
