

Remarks on Board of *Whark* Ontario of N.B.

Tuesday May 3rd 1864.

Commence light breezes from N.E. heading N.W. Saw the land Kamtschatka and a strange sail. Middle and latter part fresh breezes from N.W. heading on different tack by the wind saw Pinback. Employed in little jobs.

Latt Obs 53.33 N. Long by Chro 162.50 E

Wednesday May 4th

Continuing the same Middle part strong breezes and passing snow usually latter part strong breezes and pleasant from N.E. steering part of the time to N.W. and part to E.S.E. Saw the Land N.

Latt Obs 54.10 N. Long by Chro 152.15 E

Thursday May 5th

Continuing strong breezes from N.E. steering in for the Land which was covered with snow saw a bright Pet tracked to the Eastward. Middle and latter part strong breezes and usually with snow tracking ship every hour. So Ends.

Latt Obs 54.30 N. Long by Chro 162.50 E

Friday May 6th

These 24 hours the same as the former. Middle and latter part fresh breezes and rugged heading various courses trying to get to the North. 11 AM saw a Right whale covered 3 boats, killed and came in board.

Latt Obs 54.39 N. Long 163.30 E

Saturday May 7th

Rather more moderate the first part of this heading N.E. Middle and latter part light air and pleasant from N.W. steering N. by E. & N.W. & E. Saw the Land. Pinback and few seals. So Ends.

Latt Obs 55.11 N.
Long by Chro 164.00 E.

Upper Mr. Barnes Bound North

Sunday May 8th 1864.

Continuing light air from the N.W. steering N.W. & E. Middle and latter part fresh breezes from the Northward heading to the Eastward saw Cairings Island to the S.E. by distance 30 miles.

Latt Obs 55.44 N. Long by Chro 164.25 E

Monday May 9th

Fresh breezes first part of this day from the N.W. & heading to the Eastward. Middle and latter part strong breezes from the North trying to get to the Northward but it is slow work.

Latt Obs 55.58 N. Long by Chro 165.30 E

Tuesday May 10th

Continuing the same. Middle part fresh breezes. Latter part light air and calm and thick snow storm. we shall get North by 4 PM.

Wednesday May 11th

Continuing calm & felt a gentle breeze from the Northward heading E.N.E. Middle part heading N.E. Latter part heading various courses. Employed in breaking out provisions.

Latt Obs 56.20 N. Long by Chro 167.45 E

Thursday May 12th

The wind and weather the same strong breezes the rest of this day from the North attended with snow in squalls heading N.E. and W.N.W. toward getting to the Northward.

Latt 56.58 N. Long 166.30 E

Friday May 13th

Beginning strong breezes from the Northward heading E.N.E. inclining to N. Gale strong Gale the rest of this day from the Northward and thick weather with snow in squalls heading to the N.W. Ends the same.
