First part calm and foggy

Continues foggy lying aback plenty of
Ice you cannot see 20 kds. Middle and Latter part the
same thick fog and calm
No Obs

Monday June 20th

Thick fog to commence with and calm
Fog lifted a little saw the Land Cape Moresby here N.E.
dist 25 miles. Middle and Latter part much the same
Poleing and Warping the ship through the ice.

Latt Obs 64.10 N. Long 174.53 E

Tuesday June 21st

The weather the same saw Bow
Heads lowered 4 Boats & chased the ice took up boats
C. H. Pigeon took a Whale. Middle and Latter part
light air and some fog saw Bow Heads did not
lower saw a ship a boiling. the Land and Ice

Wednesday June 22nd

Light air and foggy the first
part of this day. Middle and Latter part fine South
breezy from the N.W. Steering N.E. & N. part passed
Cape Moresby into Cape Thadens and 6 or 8 ships
some of them boiling. Ends fine weather

Thursday June 23rd

Continues fine clear weather
Saw Bow Heads & lowered twice for them strack
at 5 P.M. to O.B. of O.B. took him to the ship and began
to cut. 11 finished. Latter part
fine weather saw Whales and
lowered the bows. did not
catch him. the Land. Ice. Land. 10 ships in sight

Friday June 24th 1845

First part strong breezy from the South
and clear weather saw Whales and lowered
the boats. Bow Boat struck one 4 P.M. took
to the ship and commenced cutting at
9 O.C. finished and commenced boiling
and clearing away the Head. Middle and Latter part strong
breezy and thick weather. Saw 5 ships and the Land is

Saturday June 25th

Continues the same employed in boiling
Middle and Latter part strong breezy from S.W. heading various
ways saw one B. H. going quick and Devilfish in abundance
Saw 10 ships some of them boiling. Employed in boiling
Latt Obs 68.36 N. Long by Chron 177.20 West.

Sunday June 26th

Commences moderate breezy from S.W.
and smoky weather heading N.E. Spoke Bank twice
1 whale this season. Middle part strong N.W. & Latter part
thick fog lying aback. Employed in boiling & scraping bone
No Obs

Monday June 27th

Continues foggy steering to the S.E. W. at
2 P.M. spoke the Catharine Phillips N.E. 3 Whales this season
Middle and Latter part strong breezy from S.E. heading various
ways. Employed in boiling and scraping bone. Spoke the
Bank Waverly. Killed of N.B. 2 Whales this season. Fog. Fog
Latt Obs 64.31 N.

Tuesday June 28th

First part strong breezy from the South
and thick weather finished boiling. Middle and Latter
part strong breezy from S.E. heading S.E. W. thick
foggy dirty weather employed in boiling & scraping
No Obs
