

Remarks On Board of Bark. Ontario of N. Y.

Tuesday June 28th 1864^{or}

Continues Moderate breeze from the E. S. E. heading South, foggy weather. We have crossed the meridian and change the day calling this day the 28th. Middle and Latter part light breeze from the Westward heading S. S. W. foggy and dirty weather. Employed in breaking out and stowing down Oil in Main Hatch

Thick Fog^{er}

Wednesday June 29th

The weather the same stowing down at 11.30 finished down Oil 225 bbls. Latter part foggy & employed in washing ship and various odd jobs

Thursday June 30th

Same old story thick fog & calm Middle and Latter part much the same put the anchor off the bow and bent the chain &c &c

Friday July 1st 1864^{or}

Commences thick weather and calm put out a new boat on waist boat crane, the remainder of this day Moderate breeze from S. E. and foggy heading N. E. Employed in starting shoes, heads & hoops

Saturday July 2nd

Continues the same Middle and Latter part Moderate breeze from the Eastward heading to the N. E. Saw the Land all along shore to the Southward of Flower Bay

Sunday July 3rd

First part fresh breeze from the Eastward standing on different tack as were visited by some natives with some Bone & Ivory for trade. At 7 A.M. about of Flower Bay saw a Brig at anchor Middle and Latter part much the same foggy and rainy heading various ways. So Ends

Monday July 4th 1864^{or}

This glorious day commences with light breeze from the North and rainier thick dirty weather heading to the N. E. Saw a strange sail Middle and Latter part the same heading various ways. Heard Old Fourth of July^{er}

Tuesday July 5th

Continues thick hazy weather with from the Northward heading N. W. by N. Saw Devilfish Middle and Latter part light air and calm heading from N. E. to N. N. W. hazy weather nothing in sight. rather dull time these

Wednesday July 6th

Commences light air from the South steering N. by W. Saw the Land St. Lawrence Bay and Sound N. W. E. Middle and Latter part light air and calm the Land and Devilfish in sight. Ends thick hazy foggy & p. Cloud

Thursday July 7th

Continues the same Middle and Latter part light breeze and calm with fog for the most part of the time trying to get to the North saw the Land and Devilfish &c &c

Friday July 8th

First part light air and foggy Middle part fresh breeze and clear from the Northward heading on opposite tack trying to get to the North. Latter part the same. Saw Cape East the Diamonds, Devilfish one sail and lots of Ducks

Saturday July 9th

Continues fresh breeze beating through the Straits of Belle heading North thick fog Middle part fresh the E. the Land. Heard of N. W. & Whales and Sound S. S. E. Spoke the Sea. Saw 1 Whale. California Cleaveland 5 Whales Robert Brown of Sydney 2 Whales. Latter part fresh breeze from the North steering South. Several Rebels and the Diamonds East Cape. Saw weather North. Cape Prince & Whales &c &c
