This Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and light breezes from the SW and 11 Men of Duty and 4 Men to work on the Ship head and the Rest employed on Ship Duty to and there 24 hours

Remarks on Board Thursday February the 15

This Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and light breezes from the SW and 11 Men of Duty and the Rest employed on Ship Duty 4 Men from there work on the head to and there 24 hours

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Remarks on Board Friday February the 16

This Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and light sea breezes and 11 Men of Duty and the Rest employed taking of potatoes and 6 Men from there employed to work on the Ship head and 2 Men Charge the Cook Jack to the port but Charles H. Thompson on Duty and Robert Muirhead on Duty to and there 24 hours

Remarks on Board Saturday February the 17

This Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and light sea breezes and 6 Men from there to work on the Ship head and 9 Men of Duty at 8 P.M. the Steward Porter from the Ship on a piece of plank and the Store Ship Boat pick him up 8 P.M. took the Steward on Board and put him in iron and 2 Men the Cook and Kitchen from the port took 54 bbls of water on Board and getting Reading for Sea to and there 24 hours
