This Day Commence with fresh gales from the SW with Rain weather and Steering NW by N for Compass and all hands Well and the Stewart Down in the Run in Even 4 P.M. Saw on White Whale and Lower for him and struck him and got fresh Line and Capsize the Boat and Cut the top 6 ft took the Boat to the Ship Middle part port under Short Sail Latter part Light Breezes and fine weather to end these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Friday April the 27

This Day Commence with fine pleasant weather and Light Breezes from the NE and all Sail Set and all hands Well and the Stewart Down in the Run in Even 1 P.M. Saw one White Whale and Lower for him 7 P.M. give him up and Return and Boat and took in Sail for the Night Middle part Calm Latter part fresh gales from SE with thick foggy weather 11 A.M. took in the top and fore and Mizen top Sail to end 24 hours

Saw 2 White Whales Middle part Blew very heavy gales Latter part pleasant weather and very Breezy weather and heading SSE for Compass to end 24 hours
