Set Double Reefed top Sail and Saw 3 few Back in in

With Double Reefed top Sail Set and all hands Well and the Stewart Down in the Run in irons 4 P.M. Blew fresh gales and took in the fore and Main top sails Middle part Rain 5 A.M. Close Reefed the Main top the Sail and near Ship to the S.W. Sea and by

Remarks On Board Tuesday May the 22

This Day Commenced With heavy gales from the South and took in the fore Sail and Laying to Close Reefed Main top Sail and fore and Main Spencer and all hands Well and the Stewart Down in the Run in irons and Saw 2 White Whales Middle part the Wind Came to the Westward and Blew very heavy and A Large Sea Running Laid up near Ship to the South and Clear Weather to end these 24 hours

Shorted Sail for the Night and all hands Well and 2 Ship in Site and the Stewart Down in the Run in irons Middle part Rain Weather Latter part fine pleasant Weather and Number Whales in Site and Sailed Boats and one Boat Struck and the iron Drew 10 A.M. took up the iron in Chase of Whales to end these 24 hours 3 Ship in Site
