Saw 2 White Whales and sawed Boats and the Whale got Lide of the Boats went of to the Windward 11 P.M. gave up Chase he and these 24 hours

Saw 2 Whales to the Windward and sawed 2 Boats and Chase them 4 P.M. gave up Chase 6 P.M. spoke Ship ~~Maestee~~ Maestee of New Bedford 3 Whales this Season 8 P.M. Short Sail for the Night Middle part fresh gales and Rain Weather latter part Steering NE under fore Sail and Larboard Keel Main topsail and every Rigged Weather and saw Number for Back he and these 24 hours
