this Day Commenced with fresh Breezes from the NE with thick foggy weather and Steering SW and all hands well and the Stewart down in the Run in irons Middle port Latter port very Light Breezes and Steering N SW and thick foggy weather do and these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday June the 20

this Day Commenced with Light Breezes from the NE with thick foggy weather and Spike the Ship Amazon of fairharen with 2 Whales this Season and all hands well and the Stewart down in the Run in irons Middle port Latter port Light Breezes from the SW and foggy weather do and these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Thursday June the 21

this Day Commenced with Light Breezes from the SW and foggy weather and heading NW and all hands well and the Stewart down in the Run in irons Middle port 9 P. M. Saw one White Whale and Sawer's Boats and one Boat got on and struck and the iron down Latter port Light Breezes from SW and foggy weather and heading SW do and these 24 hours
