This Day Commenced With Light Winds from the NW with Light foggy weather and heading SW and the Log Bearing for Compass NW 1/2 N and N 1/2 E and all hands Well Stewart Down in the Run in irons Middle port variable Winds and Weather latter part Wind SSW and foggy weather and Steering N 1/2 W Do and 24 hours

Remarks on Board Monday July the 2

This Day Commenced With fresh Breezes from the ESE with variable weather and Steering N by W of W and all hands Well and Stewart Down in the Run in irons 7 P.M. Came on fresh Breezes with thick Rain weather and took in all Sail but Double Reefed Main top Sail and fore Sail and Lowered and got 48 fathoms of Water latter part Wind from the SSE and pleasant weather and Steering WSW Do and 24 hours

This Day Commenced With very Light Breezes from the WNW and Steering E by S and all hands Well and the Stewart Down in the Run in irons 2 P.M. Late Lt George island 2 P.M. Saw 2 Whales and lowered boats and the Whales got side of the boats and went off to the Windward 8 P.M. took up the boats and Shorten Sail for the Night Middle port fresh gales with the Wind from the Westward and heading WSW 4 P.M. near Ship to the N latter part Saw 2 Whales and to Rugged to Lowered Do and 24 hours
