Remarks on Board Thursday Evenng July 19

this Day Commenced with Light breezes from the ESE with thick foggy weather and steering SW all hands well the Stewart down in the keel in irons and the Watch employed overhauled blocks Middle port came on fresh gales with Rain weather and steering SW. 9 2 A.M. Double Reefed the top Sail latter part more moderate with thick foggy weather to end these 24

Remarks on Board Friday July the 20

this Day Commenced with fresh breezes from the SE with thick foggy weather and steering SW and the Watch employed overhauled block and the Stewart down in the keel in irons 4 P.M. near ship to the SE wind from the SSW and Double Reefed the top Sail 5 P.M. near ship ship to the Westward and let all Sail 10 A.M. took the Stewart out the keel and put him down in the Sterege this Day end with light foggy weather

Remarks on Board Saturday July the 21

this Day Commenced with Light Wind from SSW with a large swell and light foggy weather and heading WNW and all hands well the Stewart down in the Sterege in irons Middle port wind from the NW and Equally weather and steering SW 10 A.M. came on heavy gales with Rain and took in all Sail next 10 Close Reefed Main top Sail latter part wind came to the Westward and let Double Reefed top Sail and heading SSW this Day Ends with Clear weather

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Remarks on Board Sunday July the 22

this Day Commenced with fresh gales from the west with Equally weather and heading SSW Double Reefed top Sail let and all hands well Stewart down in the Sterege in irons Middle port wind from the SSW with thick foggy weather and heading SSW 5 P.M. near ship to the SW latter part of Light Wind from the SSW with Clear weather and steering W and Ant Lone Dick of Duty and gave a Number for back 24 hours

Remarks on Board Monday July the 23

this Day Commenced with fresh breezes from the N.W. with Equally weather and steering West and Ant Lone Dick of Duty and the Stewart down in the Sterege in irons 5 P.M. Double Reefed the top Sail and gave a Number for back 9 P.M. took in the main Sail with fresh breezes and Equally weather 4 P.M. Moderate breezes and fine weather and made all Sail and the Wind from the N.W. and steering W & W 5 P.M. Landed Chumchea island and Paramuckin island and gave a Number of hours back this Day End with fine pleasant weather

Remarks on Board Tuesday July the 24

this Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and Calm and employed Repairing the main top Sail and Ant Lone Dick of Duty Stewart down in the Sterege in irons 4 P.M. got a Light breeze from the South and heading WSW 6 P.M. the Land bearing for Camps NW and SW distant 30 miles 9 P.M. near ship to the SSE Middle port more light Breezes 4 P.M. near ship to the Westward this Day Ends with Light Rain weather
