Remarks on Board Monday July the 6

This Day Commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from the NW and in Chase of Whales. 5 P.M. gave up the Chase and took up the boats middle part under Short Sail. Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey in irons middle part Light Sails latter Calm and Ship in Site to end these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Tuesday August the 7

This Day Commenced with Calm and light foggy weather and one Ship in Site. Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey in irons 5 P.M. Spoke the Washington middle part under Short Sail and Wind from the South latter part Smoky weather and Steering to the end. Saw one Ship Steering NW and saw Nothing to Day to end these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday August the 8

This Day Commenced with Light Wind from the South and Smoky weather and Steering to the N. Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey in irons. Middle part Light Sails and foggy weather latter part Light Sails and Calm and saw one for Sack to end Day

Remarks on Board Thursday August the 9

This Day Commenced with Light Sails and Calm with foggy weather. Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey in irons middle part and from the N.E. latter part fine Clear weather and heading NW all Sails set and saw Nothing to Day this Day. End with fine weather

Long 157° 48' E

Remarks on Board Friday August the 10

This Day Commenced with fine Clear weather and Light Breezes from the NE and heading NW. Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey and 2 Ships in Site one Steering SW all Sails set and Cutting in middle part Light Sails and Calm. 4 P.M. 5 Ships in Site one Ships boats in Chase of Whales latter part thick foggy weather and the Wind from the NE to end this Day

Long by Dr 157° 20' E

Remarks on Board Saturday August the 11

This Day Commenced with Light Wind from the NE with thick foggy weather and Put fine Sack of Duty Stewart down in the Storey in irons. 6 P.M. Spoke the bark Alfred Taylor of Edgartown with 3 Whales this Day. Middle part fine weather. 10 P.M. saw 2 Whales and lowered the boats and the Whales got Site of the boats and went off N to the Windward. 11 P.M. took up the boats this Day. End with fine weather
