

Ship onward bound to the N^o February 1857

Remarks on board Wednesday February the 25th
this day commenced with light winds
and pleasant weather from the E steering
N by E all sail set 1st past 12 steered
N by E 2 Am raised land & had
star steer 4 Am finished the main topsail
& sent down the main on and bent the
head one taring rigging 6 Am luffed
to the wind land distance 6 miles and
heft the topsail & squally
edging to N middell squally later strong
breeze 9 pm boat went on shore to trade
so ends this 24 ours

Remarks on board Thursday February the 26th
this day commenced with light winds
and pleasant weather from the E N E
lying off main star boat on shore 2 Am
returned on board with 600 mts and
few l and stored J S W taring rigging
middell dubbell reef the topsails
squally later strong breeze made all
sail 7 pm raised land & had ateite
rove new main topsail alyards fore
topsail alyards and reef tacks
taring rigging edging so ends this 24
ours Latitude 17.01

Remarks on board Friday February the 27th
this day commenced with strong breeze from
the E all sail set steering J S W thick
cloudy weather taring rigging 6 Am
tack in topsails and luffed to the wind land 3 miles
off 2 skimmers in sight middell
strong breeze later strong breeze and
squally 7 pm A boat went on shore
2 ships at anchor so ends this 24
ours

Ship onward off ateite February 1857

Remarks on board Saturday February the 28th
this day commenced with strong breeze from
the E N E ship under dubbell reef topsails
of ateite boat on shore 6 Am the boat
returned on board and kept off before
the wind steered J W between ateite and inner
middell light winds and calms later light
breeze from the E steering J W N W all sail
set land in sight the men employed
taring rigging 10 pm raised saunders ide 25 miles
to the W so ends this 24 ours
Lat 17.31 Long 156.33. W

Remarks on board Sunday February 1 March 1st
this day commenced with light winds and
calms 4 Am wind altered to the J W thick
cloudy weather sunset 4 Am 2 raised
2 spinnakers and black fish board the
boats but without success going quick
to the south middell light winds later fresh
breeze from E N E all sail set edging by the
wind to the N 11 pm tacked ship edging to
the J E 5 islands in sight the nearest distance
25 miles so ends this 24 ours
Lat 17.05 J

Remarks on board Monday March the 2nd
this day commenced with light winds
and pleasant weather from the E N E
steering by the wind to J E 5 Am tack
at ship edging to N W thick in light
sails all up the bores 5 islands in
sight middell light winds later light
winds and pleasant weather from the E N E
all sail set steering by the wind
to the N by W the men employed
in various jobs so ends this 24 ours
