Remarks on board Tuesday March the 3
this day commenced with light
winds and pleasant weather from the
E. N. E. all sail set steering by the
wind to the N. 2. Am kept off for
hunger 4 sent a boat on shore 6 the
boat returned brought off oranges
middell light weather later pleasant
weather 7 pm sent 2 boats a shore for wood
rescued on board from the shore
7 boxes loads of wood oranges
bananas sweet potatoes and fowl
so ends this 24 ours

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 4
this day commenced with light
winds and pleasant weather lying
off Luina boat on shore the
canalane came out of the arbor
4 Am boat returned on board braced
the yards and steered to the N. 1
to let her in sight and up tee
middell strong breeze 1 pm tacked ship
edging to S. E. 8 pm tacked ship edging
to the N. the men employed
in various jobs so ends this 24 ours
lat 1608 S

Remarks on board Thursday March the 5
this day commenced with strong
breeze from the E. N. E. edging by the
wind to the N. all sail set employed
in splitting wood 7 Am tacked ship
edging to the S. E. middell tacked
ship edging to the N. N. E. strong
breeze and squally later
strong breeze employed in various
jobs so ends this 24 ours
lat 1429 long 15027 W

Ship onward bound to Luina March the 1857

Remarks on board Friday March the 6
this day commenced with strong breeze from the
E. pleasant weather steering by the wind
to the N. N. E. all sail set employed in
cutting wood fitting rigging middell pleasant
weather later fresh breeze 9 pm
tacked ship edging to S. E. kept employed
in various jobs so ends this 24 ours
lat 1327 S long 14245 W

Remarks on board Saturday March the 7
this day commenced with strong breeze
from the E edging by the wind to the
S. E. all sail set 7 Am tacked ship
edging to the N. by N. E. tacking the
topsails sheets tops and runners fitting
rigging 6 Am tacked ship to the S. E. light
breeze middell pleasant later fresh
breeze edging by the wind in various
tacks the men employed at
various jobs so ends this 24 ours
lat 1339 S long 14220 W

Remarks on board Sunday March the 8
this day commenced with a fresh
breeze from the E all sail set steering
by the wind in various tacks 8 pm 12
saw a large breach of the lee beam
but did not see it a game whet hole
middell strong breeze and squally
later strong breeze and every squalls
subbell reef the topsails
so ends this 24 ours
