

Ship inward bound to the north march 1857

Remarks on board Monday March the 9
this day commenced with strong breeze
and very squalls and rain from the E by S
to E by N eding by the wind to N by E
the ship under single reefed topsails and
main top galesail 6 Am moderating
middle strong breeze and heavy squalls
latter strong breeze 8 pm Calm down
the topsails and heavy squall thunder
and lightning thick and cloudy
the men employed in various gobs
so ends this 24 hrs
lat 10° 37' S long 148° 18' W

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 10
this day commenced with A light
breeze and variable from E to N by E
eding by the wind starboard tack
Aboard the weather clearing up
to pleasant weather middle strong
breeze steering N by E very squalls
Calm down the topsails several
times latter strong breeze and
pleasant weather the men employed
in various gobs so ends this 24
hrs lat 8° 40' S long 148° 22' W

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 11
this day commenced with strong
breeze from the E all sail set
steering N by E scraped the lash
rail and varnished them tarring
rigged 6 Am came on A very squall
thunder and lightning luck in
sail to double reefed topsails
middle calm latter calm thick
cloudy weather employed in
various gobs so ends this 24 hrs
lat 7° 46' S

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Remarks on board Thursday March the 12
this day commenced with A calm and
cloudy weather 3 Am light breeze from
the E set all sail and steered N by E
E tarring rigon filing rigon whet hole
6 Am calm middle strong breeze and
very squalls Calm down the topsails in
squalls latter strong breeze and
pleasant weather all sail set
steering N by E the men employed
in various gobs so ends this 24 hrs
lat 6° 27' S long 148° 23' W

Remarks on board Friday March the 13
this day commenced with strong breeze
and pleasant weather from E by N
steering N by E all sail set lashed
the sailing rigon filing rigon middle
fresh breeze latter light winds and
variable starboard tack Aboard
eding various forces by the wind
the men employed in various gobs
saw 1 finback so ends this 24 hrs
lat 4° 08' S long 148° 57' W

Remarks on board Saturday March the 14
this day commenced with light
winds and variable eding by the
wind to the N and W all sail
set 4 Am light squalls and rain
middle cleared up to fine weather
and A strong breeze from the E by E
steering N by E latter wind all sail
N by E ship eding by the wind to
N by E planned up the fore and
main spencers gaffs the men employ
ed in various gobs so ends this 24 hrs
