

Ship inward Cruising in Codaback May 1857

Remarks on board Saturday May the 16 this
Commenced with light wind and
calms fog by spells from S.E. saw
several whales going quick 1 sail in
sight 7 tuck in sail edging to S.W. middell
blowing A moderate gale Close reef the
main topsail latter strong breeze from the
W.S.W. edging on various tacks heard for 2
right whales 3 ships in sight several
whales in sight so ends this 24 hrs

lat 55.43 N long 147.04 W
Remarks on board Sunday May the 17 this
Commenced with strong breeze from S.W.
edging on various tacks 9 ships in sight
several whales in sight 7 tuck in sail
thick and rare middell strong breeze and
thick fog latter fog 10 pm cleared of by
spells heard for 1 right whale 3 sails
in sight saw several whales so ends
this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Monday May the 18 this
Commenced with strong breeze from
S.W. fog by spells saw 2 fin backs 3 sail
in sight middell strong breeze and rain
latter 5 pm moderate heard for 1 right
whale 1 sail in sight edging on various
tacks so ends this 24 hrs

lat 55.54 N long 148.17 W
Remarks on board Tuesday May the 19 this
Commenced with strong breeze from the
N edging by the wind to the W by N
all sail set spoke ship, nil of horror
lost 2 men and 2 boats stove by 1 whale
6 am breezing on and fog tuck in sail
7 am close reef the main topsail tuck
in the fore sail latter strong breeze
from W.N. edging to S.W. double
reef topsails 1 sail in sight several
fin backs so ends this 24 hrs lat 55.54 long 149.50

Remarks on board Wednesday May the 20 this
Commenced with strong breeze and clear
weather from W.N. under double reef
topsails latter light wind and pleasant
weather 4 pm made all sail and steered
N.W. by N 2 sail in sight so ends
this 24 hrs lat 55.54 N long 149.03 W

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Remarks on board Thursday May the 21 this
Commenced with light winds and calms
2 sail in sight saw 1 fin back whet hole middell
light wind steering N.W. by W latter edging by the
wind to N.W. 4 pm thick fog 10 cleared off
pleasant saw several sulphur bottom so ends
this 24 hrs lat 57.02 N long 147.52 W

Remarks on board Friday May the 22 this
Commenced with strong breeze and squally
from N.E. all sail set 4 am thick fog
reef the topsails 7 close reef the main
fore and the foresail breezing up to a gale
1 sail in sight middell of gale of wind latter
5 pm moderating 10 set close reef topsails
where ship edging to the N. fin backs in sight
so ends this 24 hrs lat 56.54 N long

Remarks on board Saturday May the 23 this
Commenced with strong breeze from
the E.N.E. edging to the N under close reef
reef topsails 4 am where ship edging to wind
N.E. 7 tuck in to close reef main topsail
middell of gale of wind latter the same lying
in on the harbor tack so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Sunday May the 24 this
Commenced with a gale of wind from N.W.
edging to the E harbor tacks under close
reef main topsail fore and main spencers
run middell rain latter moderating 8 pm where
ship edging to the N set double reef topsails
light breeze from the E fog and rain so ends
this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Monday May the 25 this
Commenced with a calm thick weather
6 am light breeze from S.W. steering N.E.
by N under single reef topsails middell
strong breeze latter of gale of
wind from E.N.E. edging to the
harbor tacks A herd so
ends this 24 hrs
