

Ship onward Cruising on Goda back June 1857

Remarks on board Thursday June the 4 this
Commenced with light breeze and thick
weather 1 sail in sight 1 Am boat for
right whale harbor boat struck
4 Am tack in to the ship in alling the
fluke chain forade the rope parted
lost the chain the whale sunk a long
side lost 5 mus 2 lances 90 fathoms of line
middell strong breeze from E N E thick
and rain latter 5 pm breezing on thick in
fore and misg topsails close reef the
main 7 furlled the foresail we tie eding
to S E 10 pm blowing heavy so ends this 24
hrs

Remarks on board Friday June the 5 this
Commenced with a heavy gale of wind
from E eding to the S on the harbor tacks
2 Am moderating 6 where ship eding to S E
set the foresail 1 sail in sight middell
strong breeze latter light breeze and
cloudy 1 sail in sight so ends this
24 hrs lat 58° 52' N long 141° 12' W

Remarks on board Saturday June the 6 this
Commenced with light wind from the
E under 3 topsails eding to S E thick
cloudy weather spoke ship navigator
of new bedford 6 am where ship eding
to S by E middell light wind latter the
same 11 pm heard for a whale 3 sail in
sight so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Sunday June the 7 this
Commenced with light wind and
cloudy weather from E by S all sail set
eding to S by E 3 sail in sight saw finbacks
6 am tacked ship eding N E middell
strong breeze later thick and squally 7
pm tacked ship eding to S E all sail set
5 sail in sight so ends this 24 hrs
lat 58° 29' N long 141° 54'

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Remarks on board Monday June the 8 this
Commenced with strong breeze from the E
thick and squally eding by the wind to
S E all sail set spoke ship Camerone of new
bedford 1 whale 4 sail in sight 8 am dubbell
reeft the topsail breezing in 10 am raised A del
sulfer bottom tack in a long sea and flaked
in latter 4 am blowing a gale of wind 5 am
cut off the flukes and let in you where ship
eding to S E blowing on ship under close reef
main topsail so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 9 this
Commenced with a gale of wind from E N E
eding to S E under close reef main topsail
3 Am moderating I saw 2 right whales 2 sail in
sight 7 am where ship eding to S E set the foresail
middell light breeze latter the same 10 pm harbor
boat struck 1 whale line parted lost the whale
2 sail in sight so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 10 this
Commenced with strong breeze from E N E
eding in various tacks 2 sail in sight bark
naphen cutting a whale 8 am dubbell reef the topsail
middell strong breeze and squally latter the
same 4 sail in sight 3 cutting whales saw several
whales heard but with out success so ends this 24
hrs lat 57° 57' N long 141° 52'

Remarks on board Thursday June the 11 this
Commenced with strong breeze and squally
eding in various tacks suddenly dubbell
reeft the topsails middell squalls latter
the same saw 1 right whale 7 ships in sight
2 boyling so ends this 24 hrs lat 57° 45' N long 142° 17'

Remarks on board Friday June the 12 this
Commenced with strong wind from E by N raised
weather squally ship under dubbell reef
topsails in various tacks middell light wind
latter the same raised whales from boat started
starboard boat struck the keelson broke
lost the whale 2 sail in sight so ends
this 24 hrs
