

Ship inward bound to Bristol Bay July 1857

Remarks on board Saturday July the 11 this

Commenced with strong breeze and variable
heading from the larboard tack from SSW to
W 4 Am where ship heading to SSE under
dubbelt reef topsails thick fog 4 pm
SSW middell strong breeze thick fog wind variable
latter thick weather 11 pm Cleared off breezing
on heading to N 1/2 W the heading on various tacks
unharking to the W the men employed in
various gobs so ends this 24 hrs

Lat 53° 57' N Long 159° 29' W

Remarks on board Saturday July the 12 this

Commenced with strong breeze and variable
heading to N 1/2 W under dubbelt reef topsails
4 Am where ship heading to the S by W
breezing on close reef topsails middell
moderate set dubbelt reef topsails 5 pm breezing
on tack in fore and main topsails close
reef the main & furlled the foresail blow-
ing a gale of wind from the W ship
heading SSW starboard tacks so ends this
24 hrs

Remarks on board Sunday July the 13 this

Commenced with a gale of wind from
the W heading to SSW starboard tacks
under close reef main topsail fore and
main spencers hove to middell moderated
latter set dubbelt reef topsails strong
breeze and squally the men employed in
various gobs so ends this 24 hrs

Lat 52° 20' N Long 160° 08' W

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 14 this

Commenced with strong breeze and squa-
lly the W heading to SSW under dubbelt
reef topsails 1 Am where ship heading
N 1/2 W on the larboard tack saw several
humpbacks middell strong breeze latter
pleasant weather set all sail land
in sight distance 50 miles the men
employed in various gobs so ends
this 24 hrs

Lat 53° 49' N Long 160° 47' W

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Remarks on board Wednesday July the 15 this

Commenced with a strong breeze from the
W 1/2 S pleasant weather all sail set heading
to N 1/2 W by N land in sight 4 Am
tacked ship heading to SSW middell the same
latter light winds and variable from N 1/2 W
heading by the wind on the starboard tacks
broke out the after hole stowed down salt
water cask & carpenter employed in repairing a
bate so ends this 24 hrs

Lat 53° 20' N Long 162° 34' W

Remarks on board Thursday July the 16 this

Commenced with light winds and variable
heading by the wind starboard tacks of board
theating various courses middell light winds
and calms heading on various tacks latter the
same the men employed in various gobs fitting
rigging carpenteren blacksmithing so ends this
24 hrs

Remarks on board Friday July the 17 this

Commenced with a Calm 3 Am light breeze
from W 1/2 N heading to the off larboard tacks
all sail set 10 Am luffed to the wind heading
to the W 3 pm becalmed and sheered N 1/2 W
light breeze from SSW thick hazy weather
the men employed in various gobs so ends
this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Saturday July the 18 this

Commenced with light wind and thick
hazy weather from the S all sail set steering
N 1/2 W 7 Am luffed to the wind with
the head yards & back theading ESE 1/2 past

7 raised land bearing W by S distance
25 miles middell calm latter light breeze
from E 4 pm becalmed for the straits of many mack
sheered W with all sail set 8 pm thick fog
10 pm past thru the straits strong breeze
thick fog so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Sunday July the 19 this

Commenced with strong breeze from E thick
fog all sail set steering W 1/2 W 2 Am Cleared
off land in sight distance 25 miles to the E middell
light breeze latter calm the men employed
in various gobs so ends this 24 hrs
