

Ship onward Cruising in Bristol Bay August 1847

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 18 this
Commenced a fresh breeze and blowday fog
by spells from S.W. steering E. N. E. spoke ship
Charels borell & whales 7 Am starboard tack
board steering to S. E. middell the same latter
steering E. all sail set 9 pm heard for
A whale, starboard hove struck and hauled
so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 19 this
Commenced with light breeze from W.
fog by spells heading by the wind to S.
board for a whale preserved 1 pipe of bread
middell light wind fog latter the same
wind variable the men employed in various
jobs so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Thursday August the 20 this
Commenced with light winds and calm
fog 3 Am light breeze from N. W. steering
E. N. E. middell where ship heading to the S.
latter light winds and variable thick fog
saw 1 right whale the men employed in various
jobs so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Friday August the 21 this
Commenced with light wind and variable
steering N. W. thick fog middell strong breeze
from S. E. steering N. by W. latter heading in various
tacks dubhell reef topsails 3 sail in sight
the men employed in various jobs so ends this 24
hrs

Remarks on board Saturday August the 22 this
Commenced with strong breeze from S. E.
clear weather heading N. E. by E. dubhell
reef topsails 6 high in fore and main topsails
breezing on to a gale middell a gale
latter the same rain storm heading
N. E. by N. close reef main topsail
so ends this 24 hrs

Lat 57° 45' N

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Remarks on board Sunday August the 23 this
Commenced with a gale of wind from E.
heading to N. E. by E. past 12 where ship heading
S. E. moderating light reef out of the main topsail
rain storm middell light wind from S. E. heading to E. N. E.
batter the same 1 sail in sight heard for a whale
so ends this 24 hrs Lat 57° 20' N Long 166° 29' W

Remarks on board Monday August the 24 this
Commenced with light winds and pleasant weather
from S. E. all sail set heading N. E. heard for a whale
breeze Sarah sheath picked up 1 dead whale middell
light breeze N. W. steering E. S. E. all sail set latter
strong breeze and rain so ends this 24 hrs
Lat 57° 24' N

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 25 this
Commenced with strong breeze from N. W.
thick rain storm steering E. S. E. breezing on
7 Am took in sail to close reef main topsail
and over to heading to E. N. E. starboard tack
A board middell a gale latter moderated to strong
breeze squally rain where ship heading to the N.
set dubhell reef topsails the men employed
in ships duty so ends this 24 hrs

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 26 this
Commenced with strong breeze from the N. W. steering
heading to N. W. under dubhell reef topsails
3 rain storm 5 sail in sight 1 bay line 1 cutting
7 Am took in fore and main topsails middell
strong breeze latter the same squally 5 sail
in sight steering various courses so ends this 24
hrs

Remarks on board Thursday August the 27 this
Commenced with strong breeze and variable
steering various courses 1 Am raised whales
brought starboard hove started and missed the
wave starboard started missed the wave broke
foggy brown hove storer broke rebbert day
hove steerer middell calm latter strong breeze
from N. W. under dubhell reef topsails
steering various courses so ends this 24 hrs
