Remarks on board Tuesday December 1st

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and a light breeze from NW steering for compass SSW with all sail out mid part wind and weather much the same. After part light variable winds and foggy so ends here 24 hours
Lat 42.00 S Long 161.00 W

Remarks on board Wednesday December 2nd

First part light variable winds and calm and foggy steering SW for compass middle and latter part gentle breeze from the Northward and overcast weather a ship in sight to the Eastward engaged setting Tangle. the fore and main topsails rigging so ends here 24 hours
Lat 42.06 S Long 161.00 W

Remarks on board Thursday December 3rd

First part light breeze from the Northward and overcast weather at 1 P.M. saw a right whale bore and chased without success visible and latter part wind from the NW weather much the same at 10 A.M. saw a right whale bore and chased without success so ends here 24 hours
Lat 42.08 S Long 161.30 W

Remarks on board Saturday December 4th

First part strong breeze from the NW and foggy steering to the Southward middle part more moderate latter part fine pleasant weather and a light breeze from the SW saw several fine back whales so ends 24 hours
Lat 43.27 S Long 162.40 W

Remarks on board Saturday December 5th

First part fine clear weather gentle breeze from SW at 2 P.M. saw a right whale bore and chased without success mid part latter dark cloudy with strong breeze from the Westward so ends 24 hours

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the Westward and dark cloudy at 1 P.M. spoke ship which Perry had been cutting a whale middle part mid and latter part much the same latter part strong breezes from S.E. nothing in sight so ends here 24 hours

Remarks on board Monday December 7th

First part fine pleasant weather and light variable winds and calm several fine backs in sight mid part wind from the NW steering SW for compass latter part fresh gale from NW steering SW at 10 A.M. took in sail to double reefed top sails so ends here 24 hours
Lat 44.44 S Long 161.18 W

Remarks on board Tuesday December 8th

First part fresh gale from the Westward at 2 P.M. spoke to on the Sherbrooke took under double reefed main top sail and fore sail and overcast weather latter part fine pleasant weather and wind from the NW at 4 A.M. made all sails and steering to the Eastward looking for whales nothing in sight so ends here 24 hours
Lat 45.27 S Long 160.14 W

Remarks on board Wednesday December 9th

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and wind from the NW at 6 P.M. blowing fresh and haling to the Westward took in sail to double reefed top sails and heading to the Northward middle and latter part gales from NW and overcast weather nothing in sight so ends 24 hours
Lat 44.54 S Long 159.18 W

Remarks on board Thursday December 10th

This day commenced with fresh gales from NW and overcast weather trying to under Square sail at 5 P.M. the wind hauled suddenly to the SW mid part middle part the same latter part wind from the SE wrote whale in sight going to the windward quick
