Remarks on board Friday January 1st ad 1858

First part moderate gale from the SE by E lying to under small sail and a heavy sea running middle and latter part fine pleasant weather and light breeze from the Eastward and heavy sea running to ships in sight so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Saturday January 2nd

First part fine pleasant weather and light breeze from the Eastward at 3 PM spoke Ship Gen Pike of New Bedford and got a cask of bread from her and 2 bags of corn wheat employed scraping whale bone middle and latter part wind and weather much the same 2 whales in sight and the ship longer and Gen Pike Blacksmith employed making a bolt and hook for the Ship Gen Pike for a martengeal staff so ends

Remarks on board Sunday January 3rd

First part fresh breeze North and pleasant weather at 6 PM breezing on and heavy sea running middle and latter part moderate gale from the Northward and much rain nothing in sight so ends 24 hours

Remarks on board Monday January 4th

First part moderate breeze from the Northward and a large sea running at 1 PM run at S by E for compass until 3 PM layed to on the Starboard tack at 7 PM saw 6 or 7 rite whales a gale middle latter part wind and weather much the same nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours

Cruising on New Zealand
Remarks on board Tuesday January 5th ad 1858

First part moderate gale from the NW and heavy sea running middle and latter part wind from the Northward and Westward rainy overcast weather and heavy sea running nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Wednesday January 6th

First part moderate gale from the Northward and Westward rainy overcast weather and heavy sea running lying to under small sail middle and latter part weather much the same wind hauling to the Westward nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours

Lat 47.04 S Long 153.52 W

Remarks on board Thursday January 7th

First part moderate gale from the Westward and squally overcast weather middle part wind and weather much the same latter part fine pleasant weather wind hauling to the Northward employed repairing main Spencer so ends these 24 hours

Lat 47.02 S
Long 152.50 W

Remarks on board Friday January 8th

This day commences with strong breeze from the NW and dark cloudy weather accompanied with rain squalls latter part pleasant weather light breeze from the SE & steering SSE per compass with all but nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours

Lat 47.55 S Long 151.50 W

Remarks on board Saturday January 9th

First part fresh breeze from the SE and overcast weather steering SE per compass at 4 PM took in sail to scuttle reefed top sails middle and latter part wind and weather much the same steering to Northward under small sail at 12 PM were still wind hauled to the Northward so ends 24 hours
