

Remarks on board Sunday January 10th

First part fresh gale from the Northward accompanied with rain squalls and heavy sea running ship on the Starboard tack under closed reefed main topsails at 10 P.M. the wind hauled to the Westward blowing a fresh gale and overcast weather latter part more moderate at 10. Set double reefed topsails nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours
Lat 46.25 S Long 151.50 W

Remarks on board Monday January 11th

First part fine pleasant weather and light breeze from the N.W. middle part fresh breeze from the N.W. Steering N.W. per compass latter part wind from the Westward and pleasant weather nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours
Lat 46.39 S Long 154.10 W

Remarks on board Tuesday January 12

First part fresh breeze from the Westward and rainy weather ship on the western tack middle and latter part fine pleasant weather spoke dark Shepherd's whaler and saw fore ships steering to the Eastward so ends 24 hours
Lat 47.55 S Long 155.20 W

Remarks on board Wednesday January 13th

First part pleasant weather and light breeze from the Westward S.E. per compass steering middle and latter part fine pleasant weather and fresh breeze from the N.W. steering to the South and Eastward fore ships in sight and several whale so ends these 24 hours
Lat 48.39 S Long 156.29 W

Remarks on board Thursday January 14th 1858

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. heavy sea running middle part fresh gales and squally at 2 A.M. the wind hauled to the W.N.W. remainder of these 24 hours fresh gale and clear saw a ship to the Westward so ends
Lat 48.38 S

Remarks on board Friday January 15th
First part fresh gale from the N.W. and clear weather ship on the Starboard tack under closed reefed main topsails and fore top mast stowed middle and latter part gale increasing and overcast weather heavy sea running nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours no obs

Remarks on board Saturday January 16th

This day commences with a heavy gale and overcast weather at 1 P.M. the wind hauled to the S.W. middle and latter part more moderate at 9 A.M. set the foresails and double reefed topsails Steered of E by N per compass wind hauling to the Westward nothing in sight so ends
Lat 48.50 S Long 149.53 W

Remarks on board Sunday January 17

First part strong breeze from the West and overcast weather and heavy sea running at 1 P.M. saw a whale but he refused to haul at 4 P.M. down boats and chased but without success middle and latter part moderate gale and overcast weather steering E by N per compass under double reefed topsails nothing in sight so ends 24 hours Lat 47.55 S

Remarks on board Monday January 18

This day commences with a moderate gale from the N.W. and overcast weather steering E by N per compass middle latter part light breeze and foggy steering E by N per compass with all sails set employed in ship duty nothing in sight so ends these 24 hours no obs
