All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather employed stowing oil and all hands well so ends 24 hours

Remarks on Board Thursday February 25th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather finished stowing oil and got a raft of 12th and stowed it down. The S. Mays departed the ship

Remarks on Board Friday February 26th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breeze from the southward employed mending clearing up the decks fore sea so ends

Remarks on Board Saturday February 27th

All these 24 hours pleasant employed in various duties at mid night there were took a boat and departed the ship the following are their names Peter Cancha Charles Cancha March Cancha

Remarks on Board Sunday February 28th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant on weather on duty at 11 AM while the officer of the deck was at dinner the coach departed so ends

Remarks on Board Monday March 1st

All these 24 hours pleasant employed getting off recruits from the ship and other duties ship at Salcedo five men and they came on board the following are their names

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 2nd 1848

First part fine pleasant weather and light variable winds middle part much the same latter part calm clear weather at 12 got under way with light breeze from the westward so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 3rd

First part light variable winds at 2 P.M. stowed the Harbor anchor and uncoiled the cable and coiled it between decks at 4 P.M. flagged the Black Smith then him up and gave him a twelve lashes for obscene language and threatening to burn the ship. At 10 P.M. fresh breeze from the southward steering W by S per compass latter part variable winds heading to the westward so ends these 24 hours Lat 36.22 S Long 73.18 W

Remarks on Board Thursday March 4th

First part fine clear weather and light breeze from the southward heading to the westward with all sail set middle and latter part light breeze and variable weather heading to the westward so ends No obs

Remarks on Board Friday March 5th

First part fresh breeze from the South and dark cloudy weather heading to the westward by the rain. With all set middle and latter part light breezes and variable weather heading WSW per compass employed making rope for ratline stuff so ends

Remarks on Board Saturday March 6th

This day commenced with fine clear weather and light breeze from the S.E. by S ship by the wind on the Harbor tack middle and latter part variable winds and weather at 12 A.M. tacked ship heading S.W. on Harbor tack per compass one ship in sight so ends these 24 hours Lat 26.20 S Long 71.32 W
