Remarks on Board Saturday May 22nd.

First part fine pleasant weather
and light S.W. wind employed
cutting the whale at 5 P.M.
finished cutting. The wind
hauled suddenly to the N.W.
and blowing on took in sail
to double ^{up} top sails ship
by the wind on the harbor
tack middle and latter part fresh
gale from the N.W. employed
loading. So ends these 24 hours
Lat 33 48 N Long 70 15 W

Remarks on Board Sunday May 23rd

First part fresh gale from the
N.W. and heavy sea running
ship on the harbor tack under
closed reefed main topsail and
fore sail middle and latter part wind
and weather the same as the
ship Tamerlane so ends
Lat 34 04 N Long 69 24 W

Remarks on Board Monday May 24th

First part fine pleasant weather
and moderate breeze from
the N.E. and heavy sea running
ship by the wind on the
harbor tack middle and latter
part fresh breeze from the S.W.
steering N.E. So ends
Lat 36 04 N Long 70 15 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday May 25th

First part moderate breeze from the
S.W. steering N.E. per
compass at 6 P.M. hauled to
under closed reefed main
top sail middle part wind and weather
much the same latter part more
moderate wind from the N.E. toward
N.W. made all sail leading to the
N.W. So ends these 24 hours
