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Ship on ward of New Bedford E. T. Pulver Master

Oct 1 1867

at 9 P.M. Sea & Oct had all hands on board
at the wharfe let go the fast and started with
a strong E. wind at 12 P.M. the Pilot
left & beat the Sow and Piggs
So' ends

Wednesday Oct 2 1867

all these 24 hours strong & stormy gales
blowing through the city at 11 A.M. all sail
let later part the same employed putting
the boats some of the crew sick
I am very home sick no help for me
now I should of thought of this before

Thursday Oct 3 1867

these 24 hours light & westerly
wind stirring & by 2 at 5 P.M. saw sperm
whales going to the windward quick showed
the chance at 8 P.M. kept off on our course
saw a large bark steering on towards
the coast I think he is of Yankee

Friday Oct 4 1867

Most of these 24 hours calm first part
had the sharpest lightning I ever saw
& seemed as if it ran all over the ship
and the thunders sounded like ~~my~~ clashing
through the decks
