she sails well But the Good ship onward

most of these 24 hours fine breeze
from SW steering SSW all sail set
spoke English Bark Camilla found
his Long 12 miles to the Westward
of mine think mine 40 weight

2 weeks from New Bedford seen nothing
of the sperm whale kind all the 24 hours
very light winds from S.W ship heading
S.S.E most of the time several sail in sight

first and midel part light baffling winds
 later part fresh SE winds ship heading to str
 S 2 1/2

Thursday Oct 17 1867

first part strong head wind or nearly so
from SE with 10 or as near to head as
can be abidd and later part wind and
weath much the same on sail in sight
I am afraid I shall be to hard to get
by the Brazil

Friday Oct 1867

first part strong S E ship heading to the S & all sail set the Ballance of the day much the same the Prospect looks very doubtful for getting by the Brazil coast with this wind have went 45 miles to the westward in the last 24 hours

Lat 23 18 P Long 41 04 W

Saturday Oct ¹⁹ ~~20~~ 1867

first part strong SE wind middle and later
part wind. East ship heading SSE by compass
prospect looks better than it has for getting by
the Brazils

Satt by als 23 v6 M
Long - 40:26 8

So comes the third Saturday since leaving
New Bedford and the 4 since leaving my own
darling home and how many more must pass before
I can hear from my Pets may God keep them
from all Harm and grant we may be spared
to meet Again in our own Pleasant home

Sunday Oct 20 1867

all then 24 hours winds very baffling mostly from the Eastward ship heading to the southward by the wind all said 24.
