Westward ship heading N N W under
short sail yesterday stood in to the
Land Place called Pleasant Bay At 10 o'clock

Wednesday January 1 1868

all these 24 hours strong westerly
Winds with Pleasant Weather steering
to the N E so commences the New year

all these 24 hours strong westerly winds
and bad Weather saw several sail spots
ship. Huges and bark Cleone of New Bedford
the Island of Ghouffa in sight

Friday January 3 1868

most of these 24 hours light southerly winds
with Pleasant Weather steering N W
by compass

Long 75 42 W all Well

Saturday January 4 1868

all these 24 hours light southerly
Winds and Pleasant Weather steering N W
by compass all sail set

Sunday January 5 1868

first Part of these 24 hours light southerly winds
and Pleasant Weather Lat's part much the same
bent the steering sails moved Hunt the man that
had his leg broke In a Birth on deck
