

Tuesday March 24 1868

these 24 hours first S W wind with fog  
and rain steering N W and W N W  
all rail daytimes and short sail nights

Lat by obs 51.20 N

Long 173.30 East

at dark Wind SE with thick fog steering SE  
one of the Fox Islands bearing N W distant  
60 miles S of my reckoning to right

Wednesday March 25 1868

these 24 hours all kinds of weather except  
clear first and middle part moderate SE  
Wind with thick fog at 3 P M wind hauls  
S W blowing A gale with thick snow storm  
No obs suppose the ship to be 60 miles West  
of Attou Island the Westernmost land of the  
Fox Islands but am not sure

Thursday March 26 1868

all these 24 hours blowing A gale from S W  
with snow latter part steering North

Lat 54.30 N

Long 180.30 East find the good ship  
onward N Ely through the Fox Islands  
all night

Friday March 27 1868

fore part of these 24 hours light Easterly winds  
and pleasant weather ship heading N N W  
by the wind all sail latter part blowing A gale  
from N E with snow and sleet

Lat 56.30 N

Long 169.40 East

Saturday March 28 1868

all these 24 hours light N E winds with  
snow the Wack valuably employed put out  
the Bow boat

Lat 58.20 N

Long 188.01 East

Sabbath March 29 1868

all these 24 hours light Easterly winds  
weather ship heading N by the glass

Lat 58.10 N

Long 168.15 East

Sunday March 30 1868

all these 24 hours blowing A heavy gale  
from East with snow ship heading to the  
southward under storm sails

No obs suppose the lat. to be 60 or 61

Tuesday 31

so ends old march with A gale of wind  
and snow Good by without regret

Lat 58.20 N

Long 168.40 East

Wednesday April 1 1868

commences with A gale from  
N E with squalls of snow over the  
land to the N E distant 15 miles and  
ice from the ship to the land also  
suppose the land to be before Foul Bay  
as commences April
