ship under storm sails heading to the southward

Monday April 6 1868

for the past 2 days a gale from the
North cold snowy weather
No obs. Sailed Lat 39 30 N
Long 173 30 East

Tuesday April 7 1868

all these 24 hours strong breeze from the
Northward ship heading to the Eastward
at 12 P.M. came up to be tacked to
the Westward

Lat 39 30 N
Long 173 30 East

Wednesday April 8 1868

all these 24 hours strong breeze from N^W
clear and cold at 12 M commenced working
through the ice to the North find the ice
very open though far but heavy

Lat 60 24 N
Long 179 36 East

Saturday April 11 1868

Past 3 days strong Easterly winds
and pleasant weather ship working the
ice the 9th spoke ship Ocean
10 Bark Massachusetts and Ugenia the 11 Bark
President Lat 61 10 N
Long 174 40 E

Sunday April 12 1868

lightest part light N^W wind and pleasant
weather steering N^W through light ice
Sailed past 11th ship in the ice all
sail in 3 sail in sight

Monday April 13 1868

all these 24 hours a gale from the North
with heavy swell ship in the ice at
10 P.M. headed to the southward to get out
of the ice ship pitching heavy at sea
the Sulphur struck an A Piece of ice
Drove off the lower end at 12 P.M.
clear of the ice Sailed past heavy gale
from N^W ship heading to the southward
1 sail in sight
Lat 61 08 N

Thursday April 16 1868

for the last 3 days light N^W wind and
pleasant weather ship working to the Northward
the West ship in sight rather dull weather
Lat 60 55 N
Long 179 20 East
2 sail in sight

Monday April 20 1868

for the past 4 days pleasant weather ship at
long the ice 6 ships in sight 19 spoke bark
President Jose moates
Lat 60 30 N
Long 176 30 East

Tuesday April 22 1868

all these 24 hours light Westerly winds
and pleasant weather spoke ship California
flashed 14 sail in sight at long the ice
ice very close
Lat 61 00 Long 178 East
