

Friday April 24 1868

all these 24 hours strong gale from East
Ship working to the North through a
heavy swell last estimates and some
copper 21 sail in sight in the morning
at night Lat 61 25 at noon
Long 149 10 East

Sunday April 26

for the last 24 hours a heavy gale from
East at 6 AM saw the land distant
15 miles Ship in the ice one mile
in sight at 3 PM got out of the
ice No obs. weather very bad

Wednesday April 29 1868

these 24 hours strong gale from NW with
heavy swell run in the ice found so much
swell could do nothing went out
at dark went on again working to the
North North shore for sight distant 15 miles
Lat 61 49 Long 148 50 East

Thursday April 30 1868

all these 24 hours light westerly winds and
pleasant weather Ship working to the North
through heavy ice saw 2 Whales in the ice
No chance saw one ship cutting and one
boiling

Lat 62 00 N

Long 149 10 East

Friday May 1 1868

all these 24 hours strong wind from the
North ship fast in the ice all sail furled
20 sail in sight North shore in sight
Lat 62 10

Saw several Whales in the ice

Lat 62 40 N

Long 149 20 East

Saturday May 2 1868

all these 24 hours light northerly
winds ship fast in the ice saw a small
opening in the ice saw several Whales
launched 2 boats over the ice to the Whites
shore south of them at 3 PM got the ship
to the Whites saw Whales lowered 2 boats
could not strike at 9 Evening took up the
boats No obs. North shore distant 10
miles

Sunday May 3 1868

all these 24 hours strong gale from NE and strong
ship in heavy ice several other ships in
sight Lat 62 10 heavy swell from NE
ice made all sail to get out of the ice
damaged the ship considerably

No obs ship close in shore

Tuesday May 5 1868

all these 24 hours good weather ship
at long the ice 20 sail in sight
spoke Honolulu ship Hokkaido
