all these 24 hours ship fast in the ice
off Cape Thaddeus No obs 2 sail in sight
ice very heavy

Sunday May 17 1868
most of these 24 hours light S.W. Wind and pleasant
Weather ship working through heavy ice to the North
21 sail in sight
Latt 62 36 N
East Long 179 45 West

Monday May 18 1868
all these 24 hours light S.W. wind and pleasant
Weather ship fast in the ice drifting to
the N.E. with the current 33 sail in
sight

all these 24 hours light Easterly Wind
and pleasant Weather ship fast in
the ice 31 sail in sight
Latt 63 20

all these 24 hours light Northerly Wind and
pleasant Weather ship fast in the ice
all hands employed taken strips from fore
hole to get ships head out of water
to put a piece of plank on her stern
