 all these 24 hours light southerly wind
 and pleasant weather ship fast in
 the ice Lat 63 32 N
 Long 179 15 W

Friday 22
 these 24 hours fresh southerly wind
 and pleasant weather ship in heavy ice
 all sail set working to the N
 Lat 63 41 N

Saturday May 23
 ice nothing but ice in all directions
 Lat 63 50
 Long 179 28 W

Sunday May 24 1868
 most of these 24 hours fresh N W wind
 ship working through heavy ice to the
 eastward at 1 P.M. saw a whale heard
 3 boats second mate got the chance and missed
 Lat 63 58
 Long 179 40 West

Monday May 25 1868
 all these 24 hours fresh southerly wind
 and pleasant weather ship working
 to the Northward through heavy ice
 40 sail in sight better part
 got in to clear water saw 1 whale
 lowered 4 boats saw striking of him
 after wards saw several ships whaling
 Lat 64 05 N
 Long 178 56 W

Tuesday May 26 1868
 all these 24 hours light southerly wind
 with fog ship working to the Northward through
 light ice better part ice heavy
 Lat 64 20 N
 Long 178 40 W

Wednesday May 27 1868
 for the past 24 hours ship fast in the ice
 all sail furled heavy gale from N E
 several sail in sight
 No abs

Thursday the last day of May 1868
 all these 24 hours ship working to the eastward
 through broken ice
 saw ships to the eastward boiling cant get
 through the ice to them
 so ends beautiful May
 Lat 64 20 N
 Long 178 40 W

Monday June 1 1868
 these 24 hours fresh westerly wind and pleasant
 weather ship working through heavy ice to the
 S E several ships in sight to the S E boiling
 cannot get to them it seems rather bad
 but cant be helped
 Went on board Trident found my
 chronometer 1 degree to far West
 Lat 64 17
 Long 179 08 W
