fresh Easterly Wind with fog plenty of Whales
 saw one boat and caught one but the one we
 got yesterday and the head of the one caught this
 morning all hands employed hauling and
 getting out Shrocks spoke the following
 19 whales

No also plenty of Ice

Sunday Sept 20 fine Weather light weather
 Wind ship close in to the land of
 Point barrow With strong N.E. current
 and heavy Ice 3 miles off shore a dark look
 far getting south here we shall not have
 to winter here we must put our trust
 in the kind Providence that does all things
 well Lat 71:44: N Close in shore

Monday Sept 21

strong N.E. Wind with fog employed
 hauling down oil ran to the southward till noon
 Bad Weather

Stowed down 210 bbls of oil

Tuesday Sept 22

strong gale from N.E. with rain and fog
 running to the southward in company with
 ship following at noon saw a ship
 at shore on Point Franklin hauled by the
 wind to assist her when the gale broke

Wednesday Sept 23

pleasant Weather Ship. Nahasaw crew came
 on board left their ship on Point Franklin
 had for the crew later part caught
 A small Whale Lat 71 41 00 N

Saturday Sept 26 strong N.E. wind ship
 under short sail working the southward
 hauling and stowing down oil Capt. Herington
 and part of his crew on board lost his ship
 on Point Franklin at this date have 16 whales

Sunday Sept 28 ship off Icey Cape calm
 plenty of Whales 3 boats chasing No luck
 employed hauling No also

Wednesday Sept 30 1868

strong N.E. Wind with clear Weather
 plenty of Whales 3 boats chasing
 at 12 got small Whale to the ship
 at 4 finished cutting close reefed the
 topsails strong Wind

Lat 70 20 long 162 00 East
 Land in sight Icey Cape
