of Whales kept off 20 W under close reef
topails employed hauling
No obs

Friday Oct 2

strong N^E gale steering to the southward
through the day hauling at 4 PM passed
Cape Lisburn saw 2 sails to the southward
at dark

Supper by the wind at 7 PM

Saturday Oct 3

strong winds from the North with snow
steering S by E through the day at 3 PM
came up to 90 hauled by the wind to
the Eastward all hands employed stowing
down and hauling

Sunday Oct 4 strong Northerly gale at daylight
kept off 888 for the straits employed

Hauling at 4 PM passed Cape East with fair
Wind and good weather bound south hauling

I thank kind Providence for the many blessings
of the past season

Monday Oct 5

fine weather ship in bearings straits
steering to the southward 6 sails in sight
went on board bark mounted of New London
14 Whales this season

Wednesday Oct 7 1868

fresh westerly wind steering to the southward
all sail set 2 Dutch Barks in sight at 6 PM
Passed Giles Island some snow on the mountain
stowed the anchors employed hauling

Thursday Oct 18

light Northerly wind ~~with~~ with fog
passed the Fox Islands on the 16 AM A heavy
N^W gale so good night to the Northern Seas

Latt 49 12 N

Long 168 03 W all well think

the oil leaks some water

Friday Oct 20

pleasant weather employed scraping bone
saw a clipper merchant bark steering East

Latt 41 40 N Long 169 03 W

steering SE at sail set

Arrived at Honolulu Oct 30 1868

all well with 1468 bls of oil
