sight Lat 60 20 N Long 176 20 East saw one
Whale

Thursday May 20 1869

fine weather smashed ship to kill rats
Ship fast in the ice 20 sails sight all fast
in the ice Lat 60 20 Long 175 40 East

We 19 saw 2 Whales and one ship.
Boiling

Sabbath May 23 Ship fast in the ice in company
with several other ships saw several
Whales and ships whaling to the N^W
of us No obs
Lat 60 03 N
Long 176 00 East

Started A catch of Blens

Sunday May 30 1869

thrust 24 hinds flesh S^W Wind ship
whaling to the North through heavy ice
Latter part thick fog ice more open
Several sail & sight Barks concealed in
Boiling at 12 P.M. struck a heavy
piece of ice injured cutwaters
Lat 60 45 N
Long 176 20 East

Monday May 31

fog light southerly wind ice being
but more open ship whaling to the N^W
Lat 60 50 N Long 177 20 East
So goes beautiful May all well

Tuesday June 1 1869

Ship in heavy ice was going to the
N^W light southerly wind thick fog
loaded the ship by the head to bring
her damaged stem under water

No obs

Lat about 61 00 N
Long 174 30 East

Friday June 4

ice nothing But ice but rather
more open than it has been saw several
ships to the N^W saw two chasing Whales
Ship in a small place of clear water
Lat 61 26 Long 174 39

Sunday June 6 fine weather Ship whaling
through heavy ice to the N^W Whales
at 6 P.M. saw plenty of Whales
Lowers 7 boats N^W by
Lat 61 33 Long 174 30 East

Monday June 7 saw a good show of
Whales saw 5 boats at 8 P.M. at the Starboard
bow boat struck at 10 P.M. got the Whales
to the ship much pleased to get him
No obs position the same as
yesterday 22 sail on sight 2
Boiling

Tuesday June 8

fog employed cutting
saw 1 whale
