Strong Southerly Winds and Clear Weather

Sabbath July 4 1869

Ship in the straits after Saint Lawrence
by thick fog at times light winds from the
Southward No Whale hope there will be a chance
to do something before long So on as the year

Monday July 5 1869

Southerly wind with fog Ship Anchored off
Port Clarence Looking for wood so much fuel could
not Land Shall trust for smooth weather

Tuesday July 6

fog and rain ship at anchor getting Wood
got 2 boat loads at 3 P.M. took anchors stowing
S.W. So on

Wednesday July 14 1869

Strong southerly wind and pleasant
weather ship at long the ice off Cape
one sail on sight William the first spoke
her yesterday

Lat 40 15 N

Long 184 58 West No Whales

Sunday July 25

Strong Westerly Wind with snow ship off Cape
Barrow Saw plenty of devil fish got one
bark & legs of the swift and musketeers.

In sight caught our devil fish yesterday the 24
Lat 69 10 N 16 fathoms Water

4 men sick off duty
