

Ship Onward In Benueles bay Feb 1870

Thursday February 3 1870

Ship at anchor 4 boats off whaling at
9 AM boats struck at 2 PM got the
Whale to the Commodore Howland

Monday February 9 1870

Commenced ship at anchor 4 boats off
Whaling Went on shore with Capt. Homan
to cut down poles Capt. Homan had a man
Desert at 6 PM took anchor start out of the
Bay with a Light Land Breeze In company
with Capt. Homan

So gone by to Benueles Bay

Tuesday February 18 1870

off Isabella Island saw a few Whales
Employed Stowing down oil 1453 gallons
rather a small fare but better than nothing
So good night

Thursday Feb 24 1870

at Socorro Island 3 boats off chasing
Whales No I went on shore fishing in com-
pany with Capt. Homan caught 25 fine fish

Friday Feb 25

Ship - Under the lee of the land
4 boats in shore whaling at 10 AM
Largest boat struck at 2 PM got whale
to the ship at sunset finished cutting
Started for Clarion Island In company
with Ship's Commodore Howland

Saturday February 26 1870

fresh breeze from N.W. pleasant weather
Ship heading W by the wind
the Watch voluntarily employed at 12 AM
commenced hauling
Lat 18°30' Long 113°01'

Sunday Feb 27

Light baffling winds latter part
of the day saw Clarion Island finished
Hauling
Lat 18°30' N

Monday Last of Feb

at Clarion Island 5 boats in
shore looking for Whales saw nothing
caught a fine lot of fish at 2
PM took up the boats started for the
Sandwich Islands

Tuesday first of March 1870

Light baffling winds and pleasant
weather Steering W by compass
unbent the cables stowed the anchors removed
the cutting falls
Lat 18°11' Long 116°15' W
So commenced old St. George's March

Wednesday March 2

Light variable winds and pleasant
weather stowed down 1840 gallons of oil
Washed ship
Lat 18°04' Long 117°30' W
