Wednesday March 9 1840

all these 24 hours strong Trades with Light
squalls Steering W by S by compass
making all sail set bent at stem
for Tappan

Long 134 33 West

Thursday March 10

fine N E Trades steering W by S all sail
set the Watch valuably employed
Lat 19 21 N Long 132 20 West
