

Thursday April 28 1870

all these 24 hours strong & W wind with
snow ship heading NNE by the wind
at 8 A M passed Saint Pauls Island distant
30 miles Lat 57° 41' N
Long 150° 17' W

Friday April 29 1870

first part strong ~~W~~ ^W wind NNE ship
heading ~~W~~ ^W by the wind at 3 P M
came up to 10 fathoms to the southward
later part wind hauled to the southward ship work
ing at Long the ice to the southward
Lat 58° 41' N Long 150° 30' W

Saturday the last day of April

commenced with southerly wind and snow
with heavy gale from NW with snow ship
steering WNW by compass
Lat 58° 41' N

No Long

So ends April It has been a very
coarse month to the good ship onward

Sunday May 1 1870

first part a gale from the North later
part very cold ship heading west by the
wind under doubled reefed topsails and
courses Weather very cold

Lat 59° 01' N

Long 156° 30' west

So commences beautiful May I hope to
get it whole this month

Monday May 2 1870

first part and all other parts strong
wind from the North weather very cold
ship heading W by N by the wind

Lat 59° 25' N

Long 159° 20' East

Tuesday May 3

all these 24 hours strong Northerly wind
ship heading to the westward at 11 A M hauled
to the Eastward at 1 P M came up to the ice
& stops washed through scattering ice till
P M - saw & sail to the Eastward
at 4 P M reefed the topsails hauled A back
for the night

Lat 60° 20'

Long 158° 20' East

Wednesday May 4

Strong gale from the North very cold
saw several sail spoke ship Colorado
Capt. Fairies Ice looks very heavy to the
North

Lat 60° 22'

Long 156° 30' East
