Light westerly wind and pleasant weather
Ship in close packed ice. Little part of the
made some progress to the N.E. 35° sail
In sight. No whales

Lat 61° 54' Long 148° 13'

Tuesday 7 Light westerly wind and pleasant
Employed some being ship to kill rats
No obs. Cape Hareling at distant 20 miles

Wednesday June 8

Ship in close packed ice. Light N.E. wind
with foggy ship. Anchored to the ice all round packed
Lat 62° 02'

Thursday 9 ship fast in close packed ice close
to Cape Hareling 34 sail In sight

Friday 10 ship fast in the ice 15 miles S.E. of Cape
Hareling thick foggy atmosphere. S.W. wind
No obs.

Saturday 11 strong S.W. wind with thick foggy ship
fast in close packed ice
No obs.

Sabbath 12 first part strong S.W. wind with foggy
ship fast in close packed ice at 3 P.M. got
started to the N.E. ran about 10 miles through
open ice. No obs.

Monday June 13 1870

all these 24 hours strong southerly wind with
thick foggy ship in scattering ice skirting to the
N.E. at 10 A.M. got in clear water ran about
10 miles N.W. & saw some ice hauler by the wind
No obs.

Tuesday June 14

fresh southerly wind with thick foggy ship
laying at back all day saw some heavy ice
No obs. saw 1 walrus

Wednesday June 15

Light S.E. wind with foggy
ship skirting to the N.E. through light ice
at 4 P.M. came up to heavy ice took small
sail. Saw 2 seals
No obs.

Thursday June 16

Ship in heavy ice fast most of the time
fresh S.W. wind with foggy
No obs. 2 sail in sight

Friday June 17

at 6 A.M. got out of the ice kept off N.E.
A long the ice with strong southerly wind
at 5 P.M. spoke bark E. Elizabeth Swift
ice making to the Eastward
Lat 63° 30'

Long about 143° 00'

Saturday June 18

commenced with light southerly wind thick
foggy at 6 A.M. kept off N.E. through
scattering ice at noon saw East head of plume
bay bearing West distant 15 miles at 6 P.M.
anchored in Abukus bay. Natives say the
whales has not passed yet
