Latter Part Wind and Weather much the same up E of ESE So Ends these 24 Hours

Tuesday April ^{the} 25 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Heavy Gale from the ESE East up E of E of ESE

Middle Part More Moderate at 11 O'clock Wore Ship Wind to the ESE West Standing to the S West

Latter Part Much the same Repaired # Topsail at 12 Bent ^{the} same So Ends these 24 Hours

Commencement of these 24 Hours Brisk Breezes from the WSE Standing to the S Westward Saw Several Sailed I now consider my self in the Right Ground at 7 O'clock Shorten Sails and Set Lighter Batches

Latter Part same as the middle Saw Several Thinbacked and Took 2 Poffpoones to Ends these 24 Hours

Thursday April ^{the} 27 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Light Breeze from the N West at 3 O'clock Saw Spum Whales Each Boat Got one a piece Took them along side at Sun Set

Middle Part Moderate

Latter Part Wind and Weather the same All Hands Employed in cutting In So Ends these 24 Hours
