Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong Breezes from the SW heading SE at 7 O'clock Shorten Sail and bore Ship to the W Westward

Middle Part the Same Wind SW at 10 bore Ship SE Eastward

Latter Part foggy at 16 Hands Employed in Stowing Down finish at 12 O'clock SE Ends these 24 Hours

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong Gales and Thick with a Heavy Swell One Wind SE West heading to the SE Eastward at 6 O'clock Took in all Propper Sail and bore Ship to the W Westward

Middle Part Wind W West and Squally

Latter Part Strong Breezes with Flying Squalls at 5 maid Sail Wind W East heading to the W West SE Ends these 24 Hours

Monday May <sup>the</sup> 8 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Wind W East and more moderate Steady SE Maid all Propper Sail at 7 Shorten Sail heading WNW

Latter Part Same as the first at 5 O'clock maid Sail heading West Saw 1 finback Several Porpoises and Sailors at 10 heading SE East SE Ends these 24 Hours

Tuesday May <sup>the</sup> 9 1837

Latter Part the Same at 5 maid Sail heading to Westward SE Ends these 24 Hours
