Saw white water a Head stood on but
saw nothing more Watch Employed in Pick-
ing out Black fish Saw Black fish but
did not lose So ends then 24 Hours

Saturday May ^{the} 27 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Brisk Breezes
from the North heading S by E at 4 O'clock
Shorten Sail Hoist the Barque down with Gabble
a few Hours with the Same

Middle Part Squally

Latter Part Brisk Breezes
from the North heading to the S
Westward faster to a Porpoise and saw the
Same Tom the sick man on Duty So ends
then 24 Hours

Long by Chronometer
at 4 O'clock PM the 28 74-42



Sunday May ^{the} 28 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Pleasant Wind N
at 6 O'clock Took Ship at 7 O'clock Took Ship and
Took in all Proper Sail at One O'clock Came out of the
Gulf Thermometer 74°

Middle Part Calm

Latter Part
the Same at 8 O'clock Boarded a Cahn from the W
Indies bound to Baltimore saw Large Schools of Porpoise
So ends these 24 Hours

Long by Chronometer the 29
at 4 O'clock PM 74-26

Monday May ^{the} 29 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Brisk Breezes
from the North heading to the Eastward at
O'clock in the Stream Thermometer 74° Took Ship
to the N Westward at 2 O'clock Saw Black fish
Load La Bout Got Ann Took it along
Side to look for more saw several heading
to the N Westward at 4 Shorten Sail

Middle Part Calm

Latter Part fine Breeze from the N E heading
to the Westward Took one Porpoise So ends then
24 Hours
