

Saturday June 3th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Light Breeze from the E heading ESE finish Stowing Down at 7 O'clock Took in all Sail

Middle Part Calm

Latter Part the Same Breeze Employed In Tying Black fish Saw a school of Blunt nose Grampuses So Ends these 24 Hours with a Light Breeze from the South heading to the Eastward

Long by Chronometer 78.56
at 4 O'clock P.M.

Saturday June 4th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Pleasant Wind SSW heading to the SE at 3 O'clock finish Boiling at 7 O'clock Tack Ship and Took in Sail Caught 4 Porpoises

Middle Part Squally and sharp Lightning

Latter Part Moderate

at 10 O'clock Spoke the Brig Mattapoisett 200 Tons of Oil Gamb with the same So Ends these 24 Hours

at 4 O'clock P.M.



Monday June 5th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Light Air from the SW heading to the S in company with the Mattapoisett at 4 O'clock Shorter Sail heading to the Westward

Middle Part Heavy Squalls

Attended with Thunder and sharp Lightning at 4 O'clock bore Ship Wind at heading to the Westward

Latter Part Light Breeze and Cloudy Maid Sail head NNE Saw several Sails So Ends these 24 Hours

Long by Chronometer 78.46
at 3 O'clock P.M.

Tuesday June 6th 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours fine Pleasant Breezes from the NNE heading SW to clear the flood in the Edge of the Gulf Thermometer 78° bore Ship to the north at 4 O'clock Pick up a dead Whale took it along side cut it in at 7 O'clock Shorter Sail

Middle Part Pleasant at 12 O'clock started the Work Latter Part Wind and Weather the same heading SW So Ends these 24 Hours
