

Wednesday July the 5 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Pleasant Breeze East and Blow day at 4 O'clock distant and the water Thermometer 65° Heading S.W.

Middle Part Wind E.S.E. Latter Part Wind South at 8 O'clock Thermometer 63° Run Out 120 fathoms of Line to Bottom at 12 O'clock Thermometer 65 Water still Green Saw Several Sails So Ends these 24 Hours Lat by Ob 39.50 Variation 1 Point Long by D.R. 44 22 Westward Long by Chronometer the 6 1/2 Knot current at 4 O'clock P.M. 44.46

Thursday July the 6 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Wind from the E.S. South Heading to the Eastward with our Harbour tacks on board

Middle Part the Same

Latter Part the Same with Strong Breezes and Thick Weather So Ends these 24 Hours Variation 1 1/2 Point Lat by Ob 40.28 Westward Long by D.R. 42 14 1/2 Knot current setting North at 4 O'clock P.M. 42=43

Friday July 7<sup>th</sup> 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong Breezes S.E. Jack Ship at 2 O'clock Wind S.W. Jack Ship to the S. Eastward Saw 1 fir bark

Middle Part the Same

Latter Part Strong Breezes and Thick So Ends these 24 Hours Lat by D.R. 40 22 Thermometer 68 Long by D.R. 40.50 Variation 1 1/2 Points S.E. by Chronometer 41.16 Westward 1/2 Knot current running to the North

Saturday July the 8 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Strong Gales from S.W. and Thick Heading S.E. at 7 O'clock Tack Top Sail and Reefed the Top Sail

Middle Part Tack

Top Sail Heavy Rain Latter Part More Moderate with Passing Clouds Late Double Reefed Sails So Ends these 24 Hours Lat by Ob 39 44 Variation 1 1/2 Points Long by D.R. 39.51 Westward Long by Chronometer the 7 Thermometer 67° at 4 O'clock P.M. 39 27
