Commencement of these 24 Hours Light
Breezes from the West Head at 4 o'clock
Sail saw a large On our Low Quarter
Middle Part Calm

Latter Part Brisk Breezes from the S.W.
at 4 o'clock made sail heading W.
Plenty of Alouac and Hoos Mackerel caught
at summer So Ends these 24 Hours

Sunday July 30 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Brisk Breezes from the S.W. heading
to the Westward at 4 o'clock sail

Latter Part Brisk Breezes
from the S.W. at 4 o'clock saw black
fish Load Starboard Boat Got 1
So Ends these 24 Hours Lat by Ob 38 31

Long by Sp 39 1
Long by Chro 39.21

Monday July 31st 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours
Brisk Breezes from the S.W. heading
to the Westward at 4 o'clock took
the Troy Family a few hours with the
same

Middle Part the same
Latter Part Strong Breezes at 10 o'clock
took ship saw several sails So Ends
these 24 Hours

Long by Sp 39 45

Tuesday August 1st 1837

Commencement of these 24 Hours Brisk
Breezes from the West and S.W. heading
the Troy to windward at 3 o'clock the Troy
Hove aback and Load her boats at half
Past 3 o'clock Load Boat Street and
the stove this boat put up his crew and
went aboard I put off and faster to the
Whale She ran quick to windward Mr
Turner Hove of the Stern Boat came on
After me at Sunset I was out of his Site
and he went On board and stood to
the Westward After Sunset I put and
got On board after 9 o'clock took in all
topper sail and took every 2 hours for
the slower Boat

Latter Part did the same
but could not find the large Smokey and
strong Breezes from the W So Ends these 24 Hours
